


"Legal issues in medicine," now encompassed under "Health Law, Ethics, and Human Rights," have vastly espanded the field. These issues include abortion, pregnancy, and childbirth; public health concerns; and areas such as research ethics, end of life care, and patient rights.

Legal complance is currently lacking due to physicians' insufficient awareness of the legal obligations concerning patient autonomy, confidentiality, and access to health data. It is crucial for physicians to possess sufficient legal knowledge to officithely and credibly serve as witnesses in court proceedings.

Complaints against healthcare professionals seem to be on the rise, possibly indicating heightened public awareness and instances where healthcare professionals engage in inappropriate practices.

Workplace violence against doctors is a troubling reality in global medical practice, significantly impacting their physical and psychological well-being. Physicians in high-liability specialties often resort to practicing "defensive medicies" due to icar of litigation, which ultimately affects the overall healthcare. services provided in the country.

This course aims to address emotional negativity and confusion among physicians regarding legal matters, while also highlighting opportunities for collaboration. By explaining the intersection of law and medicine, it provides practical insights and thoughtful perspectives on critical legal issues. The Value added course aims to allustrate how clinicians can effectively utilize the law to enhance their professional practice.



This value-added course addresses various medicolegal aspects and laws frequently encountered in future medical practice. Topics covered include curserst. Ituram rights issues, violence against healthcare workers in public settings, reporting of notifiable diseases, the POCSO Act, the MTP Act, the PCPNDT Act, and the proper resistenance of medical records in clinical settings.
